

- The purpose of the Meridian Water Community
 Chest Grant is to support not-for-profit groups or
 organisations to deliver a community benefit in
 one or all three of the Edmonton Wards
 - Lower Edmonton
 - Upper Edmonton
 - Edmonton Green





- The benefits should fall within the following categories:
 - Improving a physical area within a community
 - Improving opportunities for local people
 - Improving life chances for young people
 - Addressing health inequalities.



Example projects could include:

- Improve a physical area within a community:
 - ➤ Address security and crime, improve the look and feel of local streets, adapt an area to consider climate change.
- Improve an opportunity for local people particularly around employment:
 - Address equality, diversity and inclusion, consider projects that assist with employment and skills issues or language barriers



Example projects could include:

- Improve life chances for young people:
 - Consider after school and homework clubs, work experience and placements, paid internships, enhanced and diversified education provision.
- Address health inequalities:
 - Extend health and wellbeing provision, healthy eating / exercise classes



- There are 2 categories of application
 - Small Grant up to £10,000
 - ➤ Large Grant over £10,000 and up to £60,000
- To be eligible you must be a not-for-profit organisation / charity / group
- All applications need to provide a terms of reference, company bank details and a safeguarding policy if applicable.





 - ➤ Terms of reference / annual report / group constitution (applicants can be individuals working together as a local group as long as they have evidence of a 'terms of reference' for their group)
 - Company bank details
 - Safeguarding policy (if applicable)

 - Promotional activities
 - All work and payments must conclude by March 31 2026

- Sell your project
 - What will it achieve
 - How many people will it help
 - Who is going to oversee it



- How much money are you asking for
 - What is the money for
 - Consider Venue hire
 - Insurance



- Timelines
 - How long will it take
 - ➤ Must complete by 31 March 2026
- What is the overall purpose
 - Which Wards will it help
 - Are there long-term benefits





- In the previous round 10 small grant applicants were awarded for projects including:
 - £2,500 to take 26 Edmonton children on a trip to the Peak District
 - £2,500 for playground signage to support language development
 - £1,000 for equipment including board games, Wi-fit computer accessories and camping gear



- In the previous round 9 large grant applicants were awarded for projects including:
 - ➤ The design and creation of a mural in the Edmonton Underpass at £10,445
 - Long term loan of Bikes and Cycle Training at £40,525
 - Provision of free weekly performance classes for isolated and disabled Edmonton residents at £18,299



- Doesn't have to be huge to make a difference
- Spend should help the community







- The application period is now open
- The deadline for applying is Tuesday 27 May 2025



- A panel comprised of Councillors and Officers will review all eligible applications and decide on the outcome
- We aim to inform all applicants by the end of August 2025



- If you are successful, we will liaise with you to organise the contract signing and payment of your award in September.
- You will receive:
 - Three quarters once all paperwork is in place
 - The final quarter at the end of the project
 - Evidence of expenditure
 - Monitoring visit
- All work must be completed and payments made by 31 March 2026





- Your project must take place between September 2025 and 31 March 2026
- We cannot accept any applications that are not within these dates
- Please consider this within your application





- It is a condition of the award that successful applicants will be required to promote the project and acknowledge the Council's funding.
- This must be included in the promotion of both the project and the work including photos / physical outputs.
- The Council will need to be kept informed about the progress of the project.
- Successful bids will be published by the Council with projects tracked through their lifespan and further promotion and Public Relations undertaken.
- A monitoring and reporting schedule will be set out in full in the grant agreement for successful applicants.



Things to Note

- All applications must benefit the residents in one of more of the Edmonton Wards
- Your organisation can be based elsewhere, however the delivery and benefits must be seen in Edmonton.
- Funding is limited and every application will be considered on its individual merits.
- Successful applicants may not receive the full amount requested - please think about how you could complete your project if you do not receive the full amount.

Things to Note

- You can apply for the Meridian
 Water Community Chest Grant
 again even if you received funding
 in the previous round.
- However please be aware that funding is limited and it may be that the panel choose to award a new group / initiative.





Things to Note

- Late applications will not be considered
- Unfortunately there is no appeal process, the decision of the panel is final
